

Walsingham Pilgrimage 28th - 31st May 2019

We all arrived safely at Walsingham in Norfolk in time for lunch on Tuesday 28th May. Then we had Our First Visit to the Holy House. Later we had the moving service of *Stations of the Cross*, when all our pilgrims read. The Stations of the Cross are around the grounds including a green hill with three crosses for the 12th Station *Jesus dies on the cross*. We went to Mass in the Shrine Church at 5 pm and after dinner a Service of

Healing and Reconciliation. We received sprinkling with water from the holy well and there was opportunity to receive the healing ministries of laying-on-of hands and anointing and an invitation to go to Confession.

Each evening at 5pm some pilgrims went to Evening Prayer, which included Benediction on Wednesday on the Eve of the Ascension. At 6pm some pilgrims went to Shrine Prayers and were moved to be a part of a prayer cycle that has been going on since the Shrine began.

On Wednesday there was a wonderful Pilgrims' Mass in the morning and Procession of Our Lady and Benediction in the evening. In the free afternoon some of us visited the Abbey ruins. On Thursday it was Ascension Day and we attended a glorious Mass at the Parish Church. In the afternoon some of us walked the holy mile to the Slipper Chapel and then walked back. In the evening we had a party. On Friday morning we had a Mass of the Visitation in the Shrine Church in the Chapel of the Holy Spirit thus marking the start of our *Novena*. The Pilgrimage concluded with our Last Visit to the Holy House, before leaving to travel home.
